## Shipwrecks & settlement off the north coast

The north coast of Ireland is renowned for its stormy seas and shipwrecks. Archaeological remains provide insights into past technological, economic and social conditions. Changing sea levels over millennia have also had a bearing on coastal communities. Recent work by **Kieran Westley** and **Wes Forsythe** of the Centre for Maritime Archaeology (University of Ulster) aims to establish likely sites of prehistoric settlement on the now drowned coast.
